 Censor consists of two bowls, chains, bells, charcoal and frankincense.

- 4. What do the two cups or bowls of the censor stand for? The upper cup or bowl stands for heaven and the lower bowl indicates earth.
- What do charcoal and fire indicates? The charcoal in the incense bowl indicates the sinful mankind. When sinful people repent and do good deeds, the Holy Spirit comes on them. The life and prayer of such people rise up as sweet smelling from the fire.
- 6. How many chains are there for the censor? What do they signify? There are four chains for the censor. The first chain represents God the Father. The second and third chains represent God the Son who has two natures, human and divine. The fourth chain indicates God the Holy Spirit.
- What do the twelve bells represent?
 The twelve bells represent twelve apostles and their teachings.

The Holy Eucharist: Meaning and Importance.

<u>Verse:</u> And He took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying "This is my body which is given for you, do this in remembrance of me (Luke: 22:19)

- Describe the origin of the term 'Holy Qurbana', and its meaning. Qurbana is a Syriac word. It originates from Syriac root 'kareb'. 'Korobo' means sacrifice or offering. The word Qurbana for Holy Eucharist used in Malayalam is a loan (borrowed) word from Syriac and it means "gift" or "submission of sacrifice"
- 2) Which are the two words used in Orthodox Churches to describe the Holy Eucharist (Holy Qurbana)?

The two words used to describe Holy Qurbana are Holy Liturgy and Holy Eucharist.

3) Explain how Jesus Christ founded the Holy Eucharist?

While Jesus and his disciples were eating in a furnished house on the first day of unleavened bread, Jesus took the bread blessed and said, "Take, eat, this is my body." Then He took the cup and said "This is my Blood...". Then Jesus commanded his disciples to remember and proclaim Lord's death till he comes, whenever they eat this bread and drink this cup. This is how Jesus founded Holy Eucharist.

4) Why Holy Eucharist is called then 'Holy Communion'?

The people who partake Christ's flesh and blood say that they have taken the communion in the body and blood of Christ. Thus Holy Eucharist is also called as Holy Communion.

To attend the Holy Eucharist, we should regulate our diet from the previous day evening onwards. It is always preferred to have a light dinner at home itself by excluding meat or fish. We should not eat or drink in the morning before going to church.

We should wake up early in the morning, complete our morning activities including shower.
